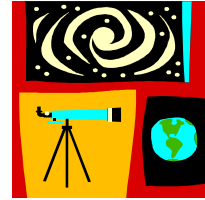


Shoot for the Stars!



Check out the CBC Observatory!

Do you have Scouts working on the Astronomy Belt Loop or Astronomy Merit badge? Interested in checking out our galaxy from a closer view? Then come to the Moore Observatory!

The Moore Observatory at CBC has one of the largest telescopes in the state open to the general public for viewing. Through this telescope, patrons can see the moon's craters, rings of Saturn, the moons of Jupiter and distant galaxies.

Cub Scout packs and Boy Scout troops can make an appointment to become acquainted with the Moore Observatory. Units can schedule a visit on the second or fourth Fridays between now and the week before Thanksgiving, and from Feb. 22 to June 1, 2008. The observatory will be closed from Thanksgiving to February, and can accommodate 8 to 10 visitors on the deck and can have between 25 to 30 people in the facility.
