- ❖ Payments can be made by cash, checks made payable to BSA. Call the Scout office to arrange payment with credit card.
- ❖ Payment coupon books will be mailed to each youth.

## 2010 NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE INFORMATION SHEET

<b>DATES:</b>	Jamboree dates at Fort A.P. Hill, VA: July 23, 2010-August 4, 2010
<b>TRAVEL PLANS:</b>	<p>The Blue Mountain Council Jamboree contingent will leave from Pasco, WA or Spokane, WA July 23, 2010 and fly to Washington, DC. We will visit such places as Naval Academy, Goddard Space Center, Arlington Cemetery, the Capitol, various monuments, the Smithsonian Institute, and many other sites.</p> <p>We will arrive at Fort A.P. Hill for the Jamboree encampment on Monday, July 26, 2010. After a once-ever experience at the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Jamboree. The Blue Mountain Council's tour will precede the jamboree encampment with one day after. The tour portion of the trip will be three days long. The return date is August 4<sup>th</sup>.</p>
<b>ORGANIZATION &amp; QUALIFICATIONS</b>	<p>The Jamboree is open to all who are qualified on a first come first serve basis.</p> <p>You must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A registered Scout who has earn the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Class.</li> <li>• Completed the 6<sup>th</sup> grade <i>or</i> will be at least 12 years old <u>and</u> a 1<sup>st</sup> Class Scout by July 1, 2010, but not have reached his 18<sup>th</sup> birthday by Aug. 3, 2010</li> </ul> <p>Scouts will be assigned to a Jamboree troop consisting of 28 Scouts and four adult leaders. Each troop will be joined by an international patrol made up of Scouts from other countries. The council contingent will consist of two troops. After our troops have been filled, a standby list of alternates will be established.</p> <p>Every contingent member will be required to attend scheduled contingent troop meetings, submit a completed National Jamboree Medical form signed by a licensed health care practitioner and indicating compliance with specified immunizations, attend a contingent gathering in Fall 2009, Spring 2010 and attend a three day training encampment the end of May 2010.</p>
<b>COST:</b>	Fee for the Scouts is expected to be \$2,395. Partial scholarships are available. Forms are available via <a href="http://www.bmcbsa.org">www.bmcbsa.org</a> .
<b>FEE INCLUDES:</b>	<p>A reservation fee of \$100 must accompany the application. A coupon book can be issued soon after you register. You may make payments ahead of time and pay as much as you like---even in full. If the total fee is paid in full by January 1, 2010 you will receive an extra collector's patch set.</p> <p>The jamboree fee covers transportation, tours, and admission fees, meals, lodging, insurance and most patrol and troop equipment. The fee also covers the mandatory council contingent training encampment in late May 2010. There are additional expenses that include uniforms and personal gear, spending money, memorabilia items, pre-jamboree troop activities and possibly additional troop expenses including building projects, copying and postage.</p>

Each reservation and application must be accompanied by a non-refundable \$100.00 deposit. Priority of troop assignment will be based on the date of receipt (at the Council Service Center) of your registration. A payment coupon book will be sent to you with the 1<sup>st</sup> \$100 payment to assist you in making payments according to the payment schedule listed below.

#### REFUND POLICY:

The following is a schedule of dates for refunds if you find yourself unable to go. Remember that the initial \$100.00 registration deposit is non-refundable. All other monies paid toward the Jamboree contingent fee to the council are refundable except as noted in the schedule below. These dates are based on commitments for such things as Jamboree registration to BSA, airfare, tours, buses, hotels, restaurants, patches and troop equipment.

**If for some reason you are not able to go, there is one other way to get a refund!!! If you recruit a Scout to go in your place you will receive a full refund, less the \$100 registration deposit that is not refundable, as long as that Scout registers with the council before April 1, 2010, and if the contingent is full when it leaves for the Jamboree. The new Scout must bring the Jamboree contingent fee up to date as of the date the coupon in the payment book calls for and make that payment to the Scout Service Center. The council will refund the money to you after the contingent returns from the jamboree and the Council Jamboree Committee approves the refund.**
