

100th Anniversary Jamboree Patch Sets

100 Sets to Celebrate 100 Years

For the first time in the history of the Blue Mountain Council, six separate designs have been used to commemorate the National Scout Jamboree. A special occasion is the reason for this change, and that occasion is 100th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America.

There will be only 100 of these special patch sets available. Those attending this grand event will have the first opportunity to purchase a set by June 30th. After that date, the sales are open to all others.

This patch set comes numbered on a display for the patches that explains the meaning and purpose for each patch. It

also indicates how many patches were produced of each design. Below you can see a what the display and patches look like.

The basic concept for the designs of the 2010 patch set are from ideas submitted by jamboree participants and committee members. There were several designs and the review committee decided to use the ideas behind all of them, and more.

The designs are intended to represent the territory served by the Blue Mountain Council. Three primarily represent Oregon, and three represent Washington.

The patch for the members of jamboree Troop 712 shows the wheat fields of Eastern Oregon, and the patch for Troop 713 represents the Wallula Gap near the junction of the Snake and Columbia Rivers in Washington.

The thirty Blue Mountain Council Scouters who served on the jamboree staff wore the patch with the apple orchards and grape vineyards of the Columbia and Walla Walla Valleys.

The "Trader" patch includes the historic "B" Reactor - the first full scale nuclear reactor in the world - located on the Hanford Reservation in Washington.

A patch with Oregon's Wallowa Lake and the Eagle Cap Wilderness - the location of the council's Camp Wallowa - is designed to help raise funds for jamboree scholarships.

The final patch in the set is an incentive for Scouts who paid all of their fees prior to the end of 2009. It shows the Snake River's Hell's Canyon, located on the eastern edge of the council territory.
