X01 BALOO Certification

To be certified as BALOO Trained (required to lead a Pack Campout), sign up for this. It will automatically enroll you in all BALOO sessions. Stop here.

A01 New Leader Essentials

New Leader Essentials is for all new leaders in Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, and Venturing. It highlights the values, aims, history, funding, and methods of the Scouting program. This course fulfills one of the leader position requirements for all leaders.

G08 Dollars and Sense: the Ideal Year of Scouting Budget

The Ideal Year of Scouting tools (IYOS) are provided to help units plan their Ideal Year. Learn how to make a budget and fundraise to support your Scouting program.
